FOR ORGANIZERS & MODERATORS

- While any venue works, try to find a free or low cost space at a local public venue, like a library, community centre, university/college campus, coffee shop, or, if appropriate, a local pub. Make sure the event is accessible to those with mobility issues.

- Consider posting a Facebook event or using social media to promote your Forum. If you have a specific theme or idea you'd like your Forum to focus on, include that.

- Think about inviting a guest, or guests from the community, local leaders, community organizers, who can help give some context to your conversation, or a local thought leader, academic.

- Feel free to include the local riding associations, OWLC/OYL clubs, but also consider reaching out to lapsed Ontario Liberals, Federal Liberals, and others who may be interested

- Encourage participation from all attendees.

- Don't be concerned about negative feedback. As long as attendees are respectful of one another, incorporate the feedback into the workbook (harassment, or harassing behaviour is not tolerated under the Ontario Liberal Code of Conduct)

- Keep people engaged after the event, have a plan for next steps and other events.

FOR ATTENDEES

- Think about what you're hearing in your neighbourhood, your workplace or school. Think about others who may not be in the room.

- These Forums are an important chance to talk about politics with people with diverse views, be open to different viewpoints.

- While being respectful, don't be afraid to speak up or speak out on an issue you care about.
