






On week #6 we asked you to weight the 10 policy themes – turns out it was all pretty even!

## **WEEK #1: ECONOMIC DIGNITY**

- Raise the minimum wage to \$17/hour by 2026 (594)
- Increase tax credits for kids sports and extracurricular activities (519)
- Introduce a targeted basic income, including for people with disabilities (507)



## **WEEK #1: FIXING LONG TERM CARE**

#### TOP COMMENTED ON POLICY STATEMENTS


- End for-profit long-term care in Ontario (1285)
- New LTC spaces to be provided in home-like settings, not in big institutions (766)
- Provide up to \$800 per year to help seniors live at home for longer, covering things like snow removal and lawn care (705)


# WEEK #2: AN ECONOMY LIKE NO OTHER

- Promote economic immigration (277)




## **WEEK #2: FIGHTING CLIMATE CHANGE**

- Empower a multi-party special committee of cabinet to lead Ontario's climate actions (385)
- Declare a climate emergency and reinstate an independent Environmental Commissioner (373)
- Aggressively transition towards a more affordable, cleaner and greener energy supply (356)




# WEEK #3: EDUCATION & LIFE-LONG-LEARNING

- A Province wide consultation on modernizing curriculum including a review of EQAO (289)
- Forgive OSAP loans across Ontario (276)
- Provide an Ontario grown breakfast and lunch for every k-12 student in need (237)




## **WEEK #3: A FAIR AND JUST ONTARIO**

- Work to establish housing an essential right in Ontario and end chronic homelessness (228 comments)
- Make it easier for first-time buyers to purchase a home (226 Comments)
- Improve systems for policing (210 comments)




# WEEK #4: AFFORDABLE AND ACCESSIBLE HOUSING

- Appoint an expert task force to recommend changes to the Planning Act and regulations to reduce barriers to building more housing (204)
- Offer incentives and tax breaks for purpose-built rental buildings (192)
- Exempt first-time homebuyers from provincial land transfer tax (138)




### **WEEK #4: BUILDING BETTER COMMUNITES**

- Empower municipalities, including adopting charters where requested by councils -starting with the City of Toronto (191)
- Expand highway capacity -- but only where it makes sense (189)
- Reduce off-peak GO Transit fares (123)




# WEEK #5: EVERY VOTE COUNTS, EVERY VOICE COUNTS

- Change our electoral system to a proportionate representation model (469)
- Introduce ranked ballots at the provincial level (419)
- Move Election Day to the weekend and provide more advanced voting locations (317)



## **WEEK #5: HEALTH AND HAPPINESS**

- Broaden the range of services that are covered by OHIP (234)
- Increase health care funding per capita to the Canadian average (231)
- Establish new model for elective surgeries to have them take place outside hospitals while remaining part of public health care system (reducing hospital overcrowding) (223)
