Biographies

Marc Gagné - Vice-President



I am currently a board member of the PKPLA as one of the two Vice-Presidents (2nd Vice-President). I was involved in operations for Greg Dempsey's nomination campaign and subsequently occupied the role of Canvassing Coordinator for his election campaign. I had a similar role for the 2021 re-election Campaign for Maryam Monsef; I have recently joined the Board of our local Federal Liberal Association (PKFLA). I have been a community volunteer with several organizations and the current Chair of a Citizen Advisory Committee for the Peterborough Parole Office (Correctional Services Canada). Although retired since June 2019 from the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board, I am still employed with KPRDSB as an Occasional School Administrator and a support to KPRDSB's recruitment process. I also volunteer with the Youth Leadership and Sustainability (YLS) high school program. In addition, I am involved in the annual Canada Wide Science Fair as a member of the Judges Administration Team. I am bilingual French – English. I would like to continue to offer my experience and skills to support our local Provincial Liberal Association.

William Bott - Membership Secretary

My name is Bill Bott and I am running to be the Membership Secretary of the Peterborough-Kawartha Provincial Liberal Association. I bring extensive experience and knowledge to the position. I have served for the last 31 years on the Association's board. During these 31 years I have served as President (7 years), Executive Vice President (7 years), Secretary (6 years), Membership Secretary (2 years including the last year), Social Events Chair (4 years) and Director (5 years). On a few occasions I have served in dual roles on the board. I also have served on the Federal board for the last 31 years including as Membership Secretary for 24 plus years (1993 to 2017). I have also worked on 11 Provincial Election and 12 Federal Election Campaigns in the last 38 years. I primarily have been involved with canvassing as a canvasser, canvass lead and canvass co-ordinator. I believe my experience and knowledge is an asset to the association as we forward.

Kim Zippel - Director



Kim Zippel is a wife, mother, business woman, volunteer, and community advocate. Kim moved to Peterborough, within the traditional territory of the Michi Saagiig Anishinaabe, in 1994 with her husband, Mark. They have one son, Keith, who is currently serving with the Canadian Armed Forces.

Kim began her career – of over 15 years - with Ontario Power Generation, where she became the first woman at Darlington Nuclear Generating Station to be licensed as a Control Room Operator. Building on their experience in the field of nuclear energy, she and her husband started their own consulting firm, Zippel Integrated Process Solutions Ltd.

In the fall of 2018, Kim was elected to municipal council for the City of Peterborough and served until 2022.

As Councillor, Kim led the initiative to create an Environmental Advisory Committee and was appointed as the first Chair of Peterborough's inaugural Environment and Climate Change portfolio. She served as a Conservation Authority Director, as a member of the Board of Health for Peterborough Public Health and was the council representative on the Peterborough Watershed Coordinating Committee, a city-led, regional group tasked with developing a local watershed plan to inform land use.

Kim did not stand for re-election to council in 2022 but has continued to serve on the board of the Climate Caucus. Climate Caucus is a national organization that connects, supports, and advocates for locally elected leaders across Canada to accelerate the transformation to communities that are resilient, healthy, regenerative, decarbonized, and socially just.

Kim is a pragmatic decision-maker, who relies on the facts. She is as an exceptional team builder, nurturing relationships that connect the contributions and skills of all stakeholders in an atmosphere of mutual trust and respect.

Virginia Walley - Director

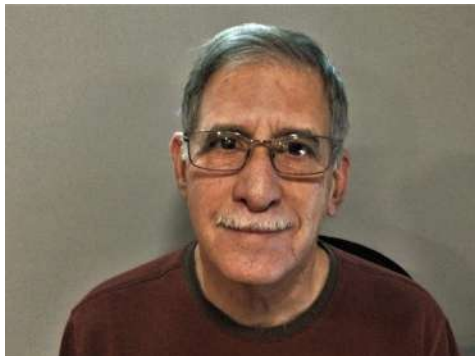
